NCLEX candidates now sit for a new version of the exam. Here's how the current test differs from the previous one and how they remain the same.

WHAT HASN'T CHANGED

- The new NCLEX continues to measure the same critical content areas as the old one.
- Most items on the exam are standard

nursing-knowledge items.

- The scoring scale is the same.
- The exam remains computer-adaptive.

WHAT HAS CHANGED

- Candidates see new item types.
- Candidates are presented with case-study items and stand-alone items.
- Candidates are judged using partial-credit (dichotomous and polytomous) scoring on some item types.

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
